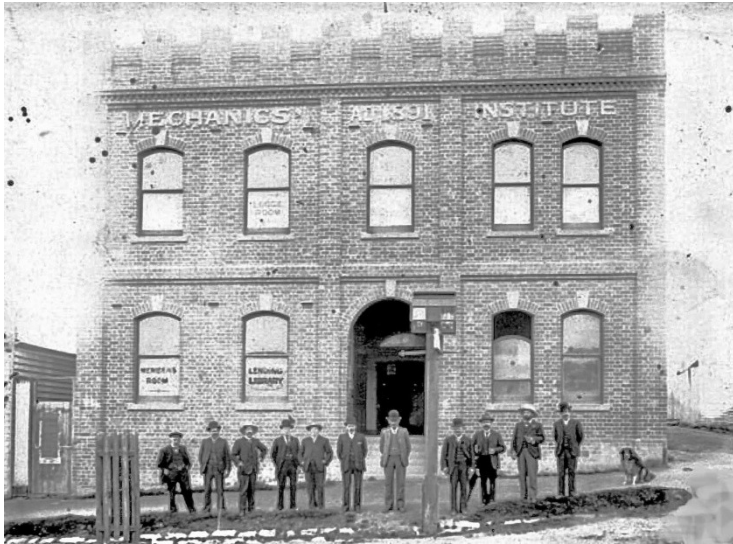

130 YEARS OF THE KORUMBURRA SHOW

The Society was formed in 1893, and three weeks later after its formation, with Mr H Sanders, president and Mr T Sutcliffe, secretary, the first show was held in the Mechanics' Hall.

As it was an indoor show, livestock could not be included in the program. It was a very successful start, with exhibits of poultry, grain, dairy produce, fruit and vegetables. Among the interesting exhibits were Italian hemp grown by J Ritchie, tiles made of clay from Coal Creek, and a set of harrows made by Mr Lightbody. The principal winner in the poultry division was A. Anderson, of Lara.

The show was followed the same evening by a grand concert which was frequently interrupted by the "quack-quacks" of an old drake who did not like having his slumbers disturbed by the vocalist and the band. It was taken in good part and interpreted as applause on the part of the bird.

The first outdoor show followed on January 26, 1894, on Radovick's paddock. Mr H J Scott, a newcomer to Korumburra acted as secretary and over six hundred entries were received.

The attendance was between fourteen and fifteen hundred.

SECTION REGULATIONS - To be read in conjunction with the General Regulations

- (1) **NATIONAL GOAT HEALTH DECLARATION** is a requirement.
All Exhibitors are required to sign a declaration.
This must be included with the Official Entry Form and must be signed by the Exhibitor; otherwise, goats cannot be accepted on the Showgrounds.
All goats may be inspected at the Goat Committee's discretion to ensure they are not infected with foot rot or any external parasite.
If any are found to be infected, they **will be removed from the Showgrounds immediately.**
All Goats that are exhibited must be in good acceptable condition.
- (2) All goats are to have a PIC Electronic NLIS tag in the ear.
The tag number should correspond with the information listed on the goat's Registration certificate.
- (3) All goats are to have Registration certificates.
Please supply a copy for each goat entered with your entry form.
- (4) All exhibitors must ensure that all goats are haltered when presenting them for judging
- (5) Biosecurity Practices will be followed, and all exhibitors are expected to respect the individual Biosecurity Practices of all other exhibitors. If you are intending to show CAE and JD negative tested goats, a copy of your health test results must be provided by email to the Show manager. A buffer zone will be in place between tested and untested animals in pens and in the exhibition ring.
- (6) Each exhibitor is to provide a bottle of hand sanitizer at their pens.
- (7) Feed and water containers must be provided by the Exhibitor
- (8) 1.5m distances need to be observed between studs both inside and outside of the ring.
Ensure the 1.5m rule is followed whilst waiting to enter the ring, during parading and in the lineup.
- (9) Exhibitors must notify the Steward of any errors prior to Judging so corrections can be made.
- (10) Agricultural Show Grounds of Victoria require a signed NVD to be available. PIC number-
- (11) **All livestock to be penned no later than 3.30pm.**

SECTION REGULATIONS - To be read in conjunction with the General Regulations

- (1) **SHEEP HEALTH DECLARATION** is a requirement.
All Exhibitors are required to sign a declaration regarding Johnne's Disease & Footrot (Sheep Health Declaration) form. This must be included with the Official Entry Form and must be signed by the Exhibitor; otherwise, sheep cannot be accepted on the Showgrounds.
All sheep may be inspected at the Sheep Committee's discretion to ensure they are not infected with foot rot or any external parasite. If any are found to be infected, they **will be removed from the Showgrounds immediately**.
All Sheep that are exhibited, must be in good acceptable condition.
- (2) All sheep must be bred by the Exhibitor, with the exception of schools & colleges, where sheep must have been owned for a period of at least 12 months & Stud Breeders who have not been registered Stud Breeder for more than 3 years.
- (3) Entries are restricted to sheep bred in a current registered flock and exhibited by members of their breed society. All sheep are to have a PIC Electronic NLIS tag in the ear and must comply with the specific regulations of their breed society.
- (4) Ovine Brucellosis Test. All exhibitors must include a scanned/photocopy of their Ovine Brucellosis Accreditation Certificate with Official Entry Form otherwise entry will not be accepted.
- (5) All exhibitors must ensure that sheep are haltered when presenting sheep for judging.
- (6) Sheep entered in lambs' classes must have all milk teeth still in place. Lambs are not eligible for section championships.
- (7) The judge has the right to move any sheep to a different class if they deem the sheep is entered incorrectly.
- (8) All Livestock to be penned no later than 8.30am
- (9) Some pens may be shared, pending number of entries.
- (10) All sheep are to be shorn on or after the 1st July in the year preceding the show.
- (11) Feed and water containers must be provided by the Exhibitor.
- (12) Only promotional material to promote your stud is allowed; material outside this must be approved by the Chief Steward.

INGREDIENTS

- 250g sultanas
- 250g chopped raisins
- 250g currants
- 125g chopped mixed peel
- 90g chopped red glace cherries
- 90g chopped blanched almonds
- 1/3 cup sherry or brandy
- 250g plain flour
- 60g self-raising flour
- 1/4 teaspoon grated nutmeg
- 1/2 teaspoon ground ginger
- 1/2 teaspoon ground cloves
- 250g butter
- 250g soft brown sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon almond essence
- 1/2 teaspoon vanilla essence
- 1/2 teaspoon lemon essence or finely grated lemon rind
- 4 large eggs



METHOD:

Cut the fruit & almonds into 3-4 pieces and mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight.

Sift together the flours and spices. Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, and then alternatively add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon.

Place the mixture into a prepared tin 20cm straight sided, square cornered square tin and bake in slow oven for approximately 3½ to 4 hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin.

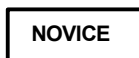

- $\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon bicarbonate soda
