INGREDIENTS

- 375g plain flour
- 2 tsp baking powder
- 1½ tsp bicarbonate soda
- 2tsp ground cinnamon
- ½ tsp ground nutmeg
- ½ tsp allspice
- pinch salt
- 345g castor sugar
- 350ml vegetable oil
- 4 eggs
- 3 medium carrots, grated (350 grams)
- 220g tin crushed pineapple, drained
- 180g pecan nuts, coarsely crushed

METHOD

1. Preheat the oven to 180C (160C fan), Grease a 23cm (9 inch) round cake tin and line with baking paper.
2. Sift the dry ingredients together into a bowl. In a separate bowl, beat the eggs and oil, then add to the dry ingredients. Mix well then add the carrots, crushed pineapple and pecans. Mix to form a smooth batter and pour into the cake tin.
3. Bake for approximately 90 - 100 minutes or until a skewer inserted into the centre of the cake comes out clean.
4. Remove from the oven and allow to cool for 10 minutes in the tin on a wire rack. Upend and allow to cool on the wire rack.

VAS RICH FRUIT CAKE RECIPE

INGREDIENTS

- 250g (8oz) Sultanas
- 250g (8oz) Chopped Raisins
- 250g (8oz) Currants
- 90g (3oz) Chopped Red Glace Cherries
- 90g (3oz) Chopped Blanched Almonds
- 1/3 cup Sherry or Brandy
- 250g (8oz) Plain Flour
- 60g (2oz) SR Flour
- 1/4 teaspoon grated Nutmeg
- 1/2 teaspoon grated Ginger
- 1/4 teaspoon grated Cloves
- 1/4 teaspoon grated Nutmeg
- 250g (8oz) Butter
- 250g (8oz) Soft Brown Sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon Almond Essence
- 1/2 teaspoon Vanilla Essence
- 1/2 teaspoon Lemon Essence or finely grated lemon rind
- 4 Large Eggs

METHOD

1. Cut the fruit & almonds into 3 - 4 pieces and mix all the fruits and nuts together and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy. Cover and leave at least one hour, but preferably overnight.
2. Sift together the flours and spices
3. Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences.
4. Add the eggs, one at a time, beating well after each addition, and then alternatively add the fruit and flour mixtures.
5. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon.
6. Place the mixture into a prepared tin – 20cm (8”) straight sided, square cornered (not rounded corner) SQUARE tin. Bake in slow oven for approximately 3 ½ to 4 hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin.

No judge is permitted to exhibit in a Section in which they are officiating.

Public Liability:

The exhibitor shall be liable to the society and its employees, officers and officials for any damage or loss occasioned to any of them by the exhibit or the exhibitor or his agent.

4. Risks: All persons connected with or engaging in any risk or activity in the arena and other departments do so at their own risk.

5. Dogs: No dogs allowed on the oval other than FlyBall Club:all other dogs at grounds must be on leash. (No exceptions)

6. Electrical Leads: Please note all electrical leads must be tagged and tested by a Qualified Tester in the last three months. The society reserves the right to remove any lead not tagged.

7. Offensive behaviour and language will lead to removal from showgrounds.
